

THE BUCKINGHAMSHIRE BATTALION – REGIMENTAL TIE.



The Buckinghamshire Battalions tie is in the form of the County colours of Black and Red.

In 1983 The Buckinghamshire Battalions tie found a new lease of life when the Companies of the 4th (Volunteer) Battalion, The Royal Green Jackets were granted the privilege of wearing the “Regimental” ties of the battalions former Territorial Regiments as per the following extract from the 4RGJ Letter in the 1983 “The Royal Green Jackets Chronicle”:-

Our links with our former Regiments were also strengthened by giving our companies the privilege of wearing the ties of the Regiments from which they descended: A Company—4th Bn The Oxford and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry, B Company—The Queen’s Westminster Rifles, C Company—The London Rifle Brigade, D Company—The Bucks Battalion, G Company—The Rangers, and HQ Company and Bn HQ—The Queen Victoria’s Rifles.

The above was corroborated in the 1984 Bucks Battalions Old Comrades Association letter in the “Officers Club and Regimental Association of the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry Newsletter”:-

We have been very pleased to agree that members of D Company, 4(V) Battalion, Royal Green Jackets and selected individuals of Battalion Headquarters may wear our Old Comrades tie and this, it is hoped, will strengthen the links between the Bucks Battalions and their 4 Royal Green Jacket successors.
