In accordance with the decision arrived at by the Regimental Committee, after consultation with and agreement of the Officers Commanding 43rd, and 52nd, I direct that the Regimental Crest to be used, where the Regiment as a whole is concerned, shall be a horn surmounted by a crown.

A pattern of this Crest is attached and I request that it shall be kept framed in the Orderly Room as a sealed pattern.

I further wish that the Crest to be used by Battalions shall be similar, but with the insertion of a 43 or 52, as the case may be, in the horn below the Bugle Strings, and that for the Regimental Depot, the Regimental Crest.
